## Proud, rich, and powerful

At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favoured, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfil his promises to her!" And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me— holy is his name. His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation. He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors." Mary stayed with Elizabeth for

about three months and then returned home. (Luke 1: 39-56)

The Magnificat is a foreshadowing of the Gospel of the Beatitudes which Jesus would later proclaim publicly. In fact, in both the Magnificat and the Beatitudes, the light of human reasoning is darkened, especially since it is dulled by original sin. The rich and powerful who are praised, revered and envied by men, are warned that such conditions will not last forever. Their privileges will certainly end with their death, if not before. Who do you want to be today: proud, rich and powerful or humble, poor and in need of God's help? Try by making a spontaneous prayer right now.
